Dear Friends and Neighbors,

The purpose of our Annual Report is to give you, our supporters, a total picture of how our funding is raised and spent to help fight hunger and homelessness in our valleys. We thank each and every person who helped to make this possible.

We accomplish this while holding administrative costs to a mere 5.1%; for 28 years we have been an established, focused grass-roots organization with a 99% volunteer staff, all having a deep commitment to help people in crisis situations. Our board governs, not manages, their responsibilities.

On October 22nd we received recognition at the Volunteer Center's "Be the Difference Awards." For the third year in a row the Valley Press/Banner named VCUM the "Fave" non-profit organization in their "Faves & Raves" contest.

Our Budget has reached \$972,470.00 this year. Our beginning budget was \$11,175.00. Volunteer professionals carefully monitor our financial monthly statements, to alert the board if shortages occur and what (if any) programs need to be cut back.

I wish to thank our only paid staff, Linda Lovelace, Operations Director, for her hard work and dedication, as well as all the dedicated Board and volunteers.

There's no need to remind you of the terrible state of the economy. What I would like to leave you with is a comment from a grateful recipient: "VCUM has helped my family so much, from no way, to showing a way which has made it possible for us to get back on our feet." Our job here is not to just give a man a

fish, but to also help him learn to fish. There is a light at the end of this tunnel and it will continue to shine through your faith and giving.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS DIRECT AID & SERVICES:

- Provided site and volunteers to distribute USDA Food in 2009 – 2,948 households (6,434 individuals) served.
- Provided site and volunteers to distribute Food for Children bags with VCUM supplements to 2,399 households, 5,284 children.
- Provided site and volunteers to distribute 5,315 Grey Bear Senior Bags.
- Additionally provided low-income seniors (160 per week) with supplemental food bags and food vouchers from our funds.
- Collected, sorted, bagged and distributed 56,900 food bags.
- Provided emergency rent/mortgage assistance to avoid eviction or homelessness to 68 households (158 people).

- Provided emergency funds for utilities to avoid shut-off to 33 households (84 people).
- Provided MCR with access to interview Latino clients at VCUM distributions to accumulate statistical data.
- Provided Santa Cruz Mountain Arts Center with referrals of low-income children interested in art for participation in the Anicka Mihalik Memorial Fund. 24 attended Art Camp.
- Provided a cash grant and items to Presbyterian Church of Felton for homeless lunch program.
- Provided food and supplies for St. Michael's Catholic Church Friday Lunch.
- Provided clients with information for free dinners provided by St. Peter and St. Paul's Orthodox Church.
- Provided SLV and SV school teachers with school supplies valued at \$2,113.00.
- Provided 378 low-income students with Back-to-School backpacks containing supplies by grade, plus \$25 vouchers to purchase new shoes.
- Provided tuition to school summer camp and science camp fees for 16 students.
- Provided Abbot's clothing and household vouchers.
- Provided 7 households and Green Valley Church with donated vehicles (smogable) in working condition.

We received \$79,400.00 in contributions from out of area donors, which allow us to mission out when the need arises



ACCOMPLISHMENTS – EMERGENCY / DISASTER CENTER

Direct Disaster Aid Assistance is provided on an individual basis after client interview and disaster assessment.

- Provided site for Ben Lomond Fire Department with VCUM volunteers to distribute sand and bags during winter storms.
- Provided lodging in motels, food, rental assistance and clothing to victims after house fires. Five responses - Brookdale Fire.
- Networked with the American Red Cross who provided us with each of the 26 units, 66 victims' names and status and emergency assistance they provided.
- Networked with MCR to provide Spanish translators to provide on-going assistance for housing, food, clothing and furniture. VCUM funded \$8,586.00

AGENCY PROFILE

OUR MISSION: The Valley Churches United Missions is a coalition of community and church volunteers coming together to perform humanitarian acts by providing direct aid assistance in the form of food and emergency rent and utilities to the San Lorenzo Valley and Scotts Valley residents in their time of crisis.

OUR IMPACT: Our primary community service is decreasing hunger and homelessness and providing hope for the less fortunate in our community. The emergency food pantry volunteers prepare food bags for 1,300 people per month.

OUR PROGRAMS – Client Direct Aid Assistance:

1. Emergency Food Pantry, food vouchers, bus passes, gas vouchers distribution.
2. Senior low-income food and voucher distribution.
3. Crisis rent/mortgage assistance to avoid homelessness.
4. Crisis utility assistance to avoid shut-off.
5. Crisis medical/dental assistance (limited).
6. Education supplies, backpacks for children, camp fees.
7. Disaster relief – before, during, and after.
8. Holiday Projects: Easter, Thanksgiving, Christmas food and gifts.
9. Mission Outreach, sharing with agencies and individuals.
10. Individual fund-raising when a catastrophic illness strikes, 100% direct aid.

OTHER PROGRAMS AND CLIENT SERVICES AID

1. Client information and referral.
2. USDA monthly food distribution site plus supplements.
3. Food for Children monthly food distribution site.
4. Weekly Grey Bear distributions.
5. Weekly VCUM Senior distributions.

OUR RESOURCES: Our support comes from caring, sharing donors near and far. We receive no government assistance or grants. We send mail appeals twice a year to generate funds. Our major fundraising drives are the "Buck For Hunger" and the Valley Christmas Project. We do not phone solicit or share our donor lists.

OUR ITEM DONATION RESOURCES: Item donation support comes from our local businesses, schools, service clubs, churches, youth groups and individuals.

OUR ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS: Only 5.1% is used for the operation of our buildings, vehicles, utilities, insurance and two paid staff members. We can do all this because we operate with a 99% volunteer staff.



MISSION STATEMENT

Valley Churches United Mission is a coalition of church and community volunteers working together to perform humanitarian acts by providing immediate direct aid to the San Lorenzo Valley and Scotts Valley residents in their time of need.

VCUM: A BRIEF HISTORY

1982 The storms which caused mud slides and floods resulting in loss of lives and severe property damage inspired this grassroots group to organize at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Ben Lomond under the direction of Annette Marcum to aid victims of this disaster.

1985 Valley Churches United was founded by Annette Marcum bringing together representatives of area churches and the community to form a distribution site in our area for USDA food, a food pantry, and social services.

1987 Valley Churches United received a grant of \$5,000 from Hands Across America and founded the Valley Resource Center to house the VCUM food pantry as well as unite under one roof various governmental and community organizations to provide a variety of social services to valley residents.

1988 Valley Churches United Missions agree to make Valley Resource Center a separate non-

profit corporation so that VCUM could concentrate its efforts to provide direct aid while the Resource Center concentrated its efforts on expanding social services.

1989 The Loma Prieta Earthquake created devastating property loss. VCUM responded to the needs by opening a Disaster Center that channeled over a half million donated dollars in items and cash to assist 3,042 disaster victims. Annette Marcum was the recipient for VCUM of the National FEMA Award for Disaster Response.

1990 VCUM was forced to relocate due to the rebuilding of Ben Lomond Market. With the assistance of our County Supervisor, United Way, and Santa Cruz Greater Community Foundation as well as the generosity of our community, VCUM moved into its own location separate from Valley Resource Center. Similar names and the common location had created confusion as to organizational responsibilities.

1996 VCUM purchased, refurbished and moved to its permanent location in downtown Ben Lomond. Fulfilling a mission of service to assist the less fortunate in times of crisis, VCUM was the only non-profit organization in Santa Cruz County operating on a budget of a half million dollars a year totally staffed by volunteers and with no government funding.

1998 El Nino storms pounded our valley during January and February creating many disaster victims. Our VCUM facility became a disaster relief center for the community. Our storage area flooded, causing losses of over \$60,000 in food supplies inventory.

2001 Linda Lovelace was hired as a part-time Assistant Director, our only paid staff. Annette Marcum continues as the unpaid Director. Volunteers contributed over 14,000 hours this year.

2010 To date: in our years of operation, we have raised and distributed 15 million dollars in cash and items to low-income families and disaster victims in direct aid for food, shelter, medical and disaster relief to San Lorenzo and Scotts Valley residents in their time of need.

VCUM's programs include emergency food distribution, direct aid assistance for crisis rent, utility and medical needs, educational supplies, disaster relief, Holiday projects (Easter, Thanksgiving and the Valley Christmas Project), and USDA and Grey Bears food distributions.

Valley Christmas Project Report

Our 28th Annual Holiday project touched the lives of 5,216 people county-wide. This grassroots project mission starts with serving all in need in the San Lorenzo Valley and Scotts Valley areas, and then missions out with donations received from out of area, to 28 agencies providing direct aid to lonely nursing home residents, incarcerated youth, low income families, mentally ill and county homeless. VCUM is truly a Mission of Love, not a church or religious organization, but community volunteers helping neighbors in need with direct aid.

Your generous contributions provided holiday meals, food, food certificates and brightly wrapped new gifts. Our Senior Project boxes were distributed to 363 seniors.

\$353,517 was contributed in cash donations and item donations valued at \$264,245 were received.

Total receipts were \$618,410. Our Administrative total cost was 5.1%. Dedicated volunteers devoted 6,508 hours and 5,654 students participated in the Canned Food Drives for a total of 33,460 lbs. of food collected. The "Grand Can Award" went to Vine Hill Elementary School in Scotts Valley, and SLV High School in the San Lorenzo Valley. The SLV Middle School Winter Carnival brought in \$1,600. Youth groups baked cookies, decorated boxes and cookie bags, and made cards. For the Stocking Project, 1,089 Santa wishes were answered, valued at \$43,560. Business Food Drives collected 12,204 lbs., valued at \$18,006.

Businesses, SLV and SV Chambers of Commerce, churches, schools and service clubs and youth groups held 34 community fundraising events, raising \$71,797 in cash and items.

We thank all of you in this time of economic crisis for being a part of this caring project.

Recipient thank you letters continue to pour in. One quoted, "You have renewed our faith in our fellow man. My heart has been opened to see the true meaning of Christmas. Our valley children are so blessed and lucky and grateful for this project."

Remember, "Hunger doesn't take a Holiday." We operate our direct aid programs 5 days a week year round.
